John C. Goodman is president and CEO of the National Center for Policy Analysis. *The Wall Street Journal* and the *National Journal*, among other publications, have called him the “Father of Health Savings Accounts,” and the Media Research Center credits him, along with former Sen. Phil Gramm and columnist Bill Kristol, with playing the pivotal role in the defeat of the Clinton Administration’s plan to overhaul the U.S. health care system.

Dr. Goodman regularly appears on television and radio news programs, such as FOX News Channel, CNN and CNBC, and authors editorials on economic policy issues in publications including the *Wall Street Journal*, the *National Review*, and other national publications.

He is frequently invited to testify before Congress on health care reform and retirement topics and is the author of more than 50 published studies on topics such as health policy, retirement reform and tax issues and nine books, including *Lives at Risk: Single Payer National Health Insurance Around the World*; *Leaving Women Behind: Modern Families, Outdated Laws*; and the trailblazing *Patient Power: Solving America’s Health Care Crisis*.

**Former Governor of Delaware
NCPA Board Chairman**

Pete du Pont has served as a state legislator, U.S. Congressman, Governor of Delaware, and a Republican candidate for President of the United States. He began his political career in 1968 with his election to the House of Representatives of the Delaware General Assembly. He also served in the U.S. House of Representatives for six years and was a member of the Foreign Affairs Committee. In 1975 Governor du Pont was picked by *Time* magazine as one of America's "200 Faces for the Future." He has been NCPA Board Chairman since 2004.

During his tenure as Delaware's Governor, du Pont restored financial integrity to the state government, signing two income tax reduction measures into law and a constitutional amendment that restrained future tax increases and limited government spending.

Gov. du Pont co-founded *IntellectualCapital.com*, a weekly on-line public policy journal featuring the leading ideas of renowned public policy thinkers. He served as editor of this e-zine and bylined his own column until its sale in 2000. *Newsstation.com* named du Pont as one of the "50 best, most important and most influential journalists on the Internet." And *Yahoo! Internet Life* awarded *IntellectualCapital.com* the Best Political Commentary site of 1998.
